INTERFAITH BY LAWS

CURRENT: ARTICLE 4 - MEMBERSHIP

Section 4.1. Eligibility

Membership privileges are open to any person of the Jewish faith, upon attaining the age of majority, whether that identity is established by birth or by conversion as approved by the Senior Rabbi. The Congregation is committed to the ideal of inclusion by welcoming extended family of members, even those who practice other faiths, and by encouraging their participation in the life of the Congregation as much as possible.

Section 4.3. Powers and Duties

- A. Each member in good standing shall be entitled to attend any regular or special meeting of the Board of Trustees, the annual meeting and any Congregational special meeting.
- B. Each member in good standing shall be entitled to one vote on Congregational matters at the annual meeting or any Congregational special meeting as defined in Section 10.1.C.

- A. Membership privileges are open to any person of the Jewish faith, upon attaining the age of majority, whether that identity is established by birth or by conversion as approved by the Senior Rabbi.
- B. Membership privileges are also open to any person who upon attaining the age of majority, and who at the time of application for membership, is married to [or is in a committed relationship with] someone who is Jewish.
- C. Membership privileges are also open to any person who upon attaining the age of majority, and who at the time of application for membership, is raising children in the Jewish faith.
- D. The Congregation is committed to the ideal of inclusion by welcoming extended family of members, even those who practice other faiths, and by encouraging their participation in the life of the Congregation as much as possible.

Section 4.3. Powers and Duties

- A. Each member in good standing shall be entitled to attend any regular or special meeting of the Board of Trustees, the annual meeting and any Congregational special meeting.
- B. Each member in good standing shall be entitled to one vote on Congregational matters at the annual meeting or any Congregational special meeting as defined in Section 10.1.C.
- <u>C. Notwithstanding the foregoing, to serve as Chairperson of a Committee, Member of the Board of Trustees or Officer of the congregation, the member shall be of the Jewish faith.</u>
