Avi Melamed אבי מלמד וفي ميلاميد Geopolitical Middle East Expert, Intelligence Analyst, Former Israeli Intelligence Official and Senior Arab Affairs Advisor. Founder of Inside The Middle East Intelligence Perspectives [ITME], an apolitical, non-partisan educational non-profit institute. Author of three books on the region. His recent book is "Inside The Middle East | Entering a New Era." Avi is also the author, producer, and host of a documentary series on Jerusalem, "The Seam Line," a five-part docuseries exploring the many layers of the conflict in and over Jerusalem. His newest project, Inside The Middle East | The Primer, is a one-hour educational video designed to provide a Western audience with an understanding of the factors shaping the region, equipping diverse viewers with vital education through on-the-ground filming and authentic voices from the Arab and Muslim world often absent from Western discourse. Avi is Fluent in Hebrew, Arabic, and English. He is a frequent commentator on international media platforms such as Al-Arabiya, Al-Hura, BBC, CNN, I24 News, FOX, France24, Sky News and many more. He is a recognized expert featured in ABC, AP, Bloomberg, the Financial Times, the Hill, NBC, Newsweek, Reuters, and the Wall Street Journal, just to name a few. Hayvi Bouzo هيني بوظو is a highly respected American broadcast journalist born and raised in Damascus, Syria. With a history of critically acclaimed TV and radio shows, she has made a significant impact in her field. Hayvi is the co-founder and host of the Yalla show and Yalla Productions, providing a platform for positive and inspirational voices in the Middle East and North Africa (MENA). At Yalla Productions, Hayvi leads efforts to counter misinformation and disinformation on social media by sharing true, untold stories and diverse perspectives in both Arabic and English. This mission is central to her work, as she strives to shed light on suppressed narratives and promote a more informed and empathetic world. She has also served as a bureau chief for Orient News in Washington, DC, and hosted "The Axis" show, where she interviewed high-profile guests, which was viewed by millions worldwide. Her insightful reporting and dynamic style have earned her numerous recognitions and accolades for her achievements. Hayvi's mixed background has influenced her passion for giving a voice to marginalized communities. In her work, she focuses on confronting hate and antisemitism while promoting positive values and fostering peace and coexistence among people in the MENA region.

Hussain Abdul-Hussain حين عبد الحسين is a distinguished analyst specializing in Iranian affairs, with a deep focus on the Gulf region and Yemen. Of Shia Iraqi and Lebanese heritage, Hussain was born and raised in Beirut, Baghdad, and Baalbek—cities at the heart of major Middle Eastern events. He holds a degree in History and Archaeology from the American University of Beirut, where his journey in journalism began. Hussain worked as a reporter and later as managing editor at Beirut's The Daily Star, covering conflicts along the Lebanese-Israeli border and in Iraq. In Washington, Hussain played a pivotal role in establishing and managing Alhurra Iraq, an Arabic satellite network. He later served as the head of the Washington Bureau for the Kuwaiti daily Alrai. As a Visiting Fellow at Chatham House in London, he contributed to international discourse, with his work appearing in The New York Times, The Washington Post, and various Arabic publications. His analysis has been cited by Vox, The Jerusalem Post, and Newsweek, and he frequently shares his expertise on CNN, MSNBC, and major Arabic satellite networks. Currently, Hussain is a research fellow at the Foundation for Defense of Democracies (FDD), where he continues to provide invaluable insights into the complexities of the Gulf region and Yemen.



Andrew Schuster

With my background as the grandson of Holocaust survivors, I have a personal understanding of the dangers that propaganda and misinformation can pose to society. Throughout my career, I have been committed to combating misinformation through various avenues, including my experience as the CEO of Further Insights, a digital marketing firm specializing in social media, along with prior experience working at Baltimore Sun, and as a former board member of WellAware, a nonprofit dedicated to providing sustainable water solutions in East Africa.

is an Egyptian award-winning writer and political analyst specializing in governance, geopolitics, and defense policy in the Middle East and the Eastern Mediterranean. She has been recognized for her leading role as a civil rights activist in the Arab Spring revolutions of 2010-2011 and for her uncommon stance as an Arab Muslim intellectual in support of Israel's war against Hamas in 2023. Dalia studied international relations, with a focus on international security studies, at the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy, Tufts University (in the United States). Dalia worked in leading positions at major regional and international think tanks and civil society organizations, where she wrote dozens of papers analyzing the geopolitics of the Eastern Mediterranean region, advocated for peace and democracy in the Middle East, and fought tough political and cultural battles against radical Islamist groups in Arab countries. As a social entrepreneur, Dalia co-founded and led the Liberal Democracy Institute (LDI) in 2015 and the Center for Middle East and Eastern Mediterranean Studies (MEEM) in 2019. Before that, Dalia served as the Executive Director of the Cairo-based Ibn Khaldun Center for Democratic Studies and as the Regional Director in the Middle East and North Africa for the Washington-based American Islamic Congress (AIC). Dalia is also a member of several regional and international voluntary initiatives for peace and liberalism, such as the Clarity Coalition and Diplomats. Dalia authored the best-selling book "The Curious Case of the Three-Legged Wolf - Egypt: Military, Islamism, and Liberal Democracy" (2019) and other internationally acclaimed books dating back to 2006. Dalia's next book project "The Coalition of Odds" explores the reshuffling of power coalitions in the greater Middle East and their rising influence on the historical and renewed conflicts between modern-day world superpowers. In November 2023, Dalia had to flee Egypt, running for her life. During the 2023 conflict between Hamas and Israel, Dalia condemned Hamas's October 7 attack on Israeli civilians and expressed strong support for Israel's military retaliation against Hamas. Her public stance led to significant backlash in Egypt, resulting in threats to her safety and accusations of espionage and incitement of war crimes. Now, Dalia lives in the United States, where she is determined to continue her fight against radical Islamists and her activism for peace in the Middle East.
